

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The seventh (7th) Meeting of the National Council on Youth Development (NCYD), with the theme "Transforming and Repositioning the Nigerian Youth to Thrive and Catalyze Economic Development" was held at the Multipurpose Hall, Government House, Maiduguri, Borno State, from Tuesday, 10th to Thursday, 12th December, 2024.

The meeting was attended by Four Hundred and Ninety-Eight (498) participants, including the Executive Governor of Borno State, Honourable Minister of Youth Development, Federal Permanent Secretaries for the Ministries of Youth Development and Foreign Affairs, Honourable Commissioners responsible for Youth Development from various States of the Federation and the Federal Capital Territory, State Permanent Secretaries, Director-General and Directors of related Federal and State Ministries and Agencies, officials from Federal and State Ministries and Agencies, development Partners, Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Academia, and members of the Press.

The meeting was preceded by a two-day Technical Session chaired by Mr. Olubunmi Olusanya, Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Youth Development. During the session, a total of seventy-eight (78) memoranda were received and evaluated from Federal and State Ministries of Youth Development nationwide, including the FCT, NGOs and Academia. Recommendations were then made for onward presentation to the Council for consideration.

The opening ceremony of the Council meeting commenced with a welcome address by the Honourable Commissioner for Youth Empowerment and Sports, Borno State, Comrade Saina Buba. Following this, goodwill messages were delivered by representatives from the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), Dr. Babatunde Adelekan, the United Nations Office on Drugs Crime (UNODC), Mr. Yerima Mustapha, the Office of the National Security Adviser, Mrs. Iyem, the National Association of Youth Workers (NYWA), Mr. Durotoye, and the Honourable Minister of Foreign Affairs ably represented by Dr. Dunuma Ibrahim, the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Thereafter, the meeting featured a paper presentation by Professor Musa Abdullahi, the guest speaker, on 'Transforming and Repositioning the Nigerian Youth to Thrive and Catalyze Economic Development. His lecture provided an overview of the youth in Nigeria, highlighted the role of Nigerian youth as catalysts for development, discussed the challenges they face, explored the relationship between Nigerian youth and national development, and offered strategies for transforming and repositioning the youth along with his recommendations.

It is noteworthy that the Director General of Citizenship and Leadership Training Centre (C&LTC), Mr. Adesoji Eniade also delivered a presentation on the Role of Citizenship and Leadership Training in Repositioning the Nigerian Youth for Economic Prosperity.

The Keynote Address was delivered by the Honourable Minister of Youth Development, Comrade Ayodele Olawande, followed by the Chief Host, His Excellency, Professor Babagana Umara Zulum, CON, MNI, FNSE,





FNIAE, Executive Governor of Borno State, who officially declared the 7th Meeting of the National Council on Youth Development open. In his speech, the Honourable Minister of Youth Development stated that the Federal Government remains committed to working with all stakeholders to achieve the outcomes of the Council and create a brighter future where every young Nigerian have access to quality education, healthcare and economic opportunities.

The vote of thanks was then delivered by the Honourable Commissioner for Youth Development, Cross River State, Barrister Ijom Odum Ukam on behalf of the Forum of State Commissioners for Youth Development and Mr. Chukwuka Anthony, Director of Planning, Research, and Statistics at FMYD.

The Council's Session commenced with the Honourable Minister of Youth Development, who also serves as the Chairman of the Council, setting forth the procedures for the meeting. As the session progressed, the Chairman presented seventy-three (73) memoranda to the Council, which included various proposals, reports, and initiatives aimed at enhancing youth development across the nation.

After thorough deliberations, the Council approved Twenty-Seven (27) Action Memoranda, which will be implemented to address key areas identified for improvement. Additionally, Twenty (20) Memoranda were stepped down, due to insufficient information and the Council also took note of twenty (20) Memoranda that were acknowledged for their informational value but did not require council action, while Six (6) Memoranda were merged with other Memoranda with similar requests.

At the end of the Council Meeting, a Communique was issued on critical concern as affecting Youth Development. Following extensive discussions, some observations were made and Council unanimously agreed and adopted the resolutions.



#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Seventh (7th) Meeting of the National Council on Youth Development (NCYD), with the theme "Transforming and Repositioning the Nigerian Youth to Thrive and Catalyze Economic Development", was held at the Government House Multi-purpose Hall, Maiduguri, Borno State, from Monday, 9th – Friday, 13th December, 2024. The Meeting was tagged "Borno 2024" by the Borno State Government.

The National Council on Youth Development (NCYD) is the highest policy making body on matters relating to Youths in Nigeria. The NCYD comprises the Honourable Minister of the Federal Ministry of Youth Development as the Chairman, the thirty-six (36) States Commissioners in charge of Youth Ministries in the States, including the FCT, and the Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Youth Development as the Secretary to the Council. The Technical Committee of the NCYD includes the Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Youth Development as the Chairman and the thirty-six (36) States Permanent Secretaries of States' Ministries in charge of Youth matters, including the FCT, as members.

#### 2.0 ATTENDANCE

The Meeting was attended by Five Hundred and Four (504) participants, including the Honourable Minister of Youth Development, Comrade Ayodele Olawande; His Excellency, the Executive Governor of Borno State, Prof. Babagana Umara Zulum; the Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Youth Development, Mr. Olubunmi Olusanya; representative of the Inspector-General of Police; the Right Honourable Speaker of the Borno State House of Assembly; the All Progressive Congress (APC) State Chairman; the Rt. Hon. Speaker of the Borno State House of Assembly; other members of the State Assembly; the Secretary to the Borno State Government; the Head of Service of Borno State; Senior Special Assistants and Special Assistants to the President; Chairman of the Borno Elders Forum, represented by the Secretary of the Forum and Chairman of the Borno Civil Service Commission and other members of the Forum; Honourable Commissioner of Youth, Sports Development and Poverty Alleviation, Borno State; Honourable Commissioners of Youth Development from across the thirty-six (36) States of the Federation including the Federal Capital Territory (FCT); Honourable Commissioners and members of the Borno State Executive Council; Security Commanders and members of the Borno State Security Council; Special Advisers; Senior Technical Assistants; Senior Special Assistants and Special Assistants to the Governor of Borno State; members of the State Working Committee of the APC; Permanent Secretaries; Chairmen of Commissions; Chief Executives of Boards and Parastatals both State and Federal; officials from Federal and State Ministries and Agencies; Local Government Chairmen; Development Partners; Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs); members of Civil Society Organisations (NGOs); Labour leaders; delegates to the 7th NCYD; Academia; Youths from across the nation; and members of the press.





#### 3.0 TECHNICAL SESSION

#### 3.1 OPENING

The Technical Meeting commenced with the recitation of the National Anthem. The Honourable Commissioner for Youth Empowerment and Sports, Borno State, Honourable Comrade Saina Buba, delivered the welcome address, while the opening remarks and the procedure for conducting the Technical Session were delivered by the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Youth Development, Mr. Olubunmi Olusanya.

The Director-General of the Citizenship and Leadership Training Centre (C&LTC), Mr. Adesoji Eniade, mni, presented a paper on the role of citizenship and leadership training in repositioning Nigerian youth for economic prosperity. Thereafter, the sessions broke into four thematic groups: Governance, Jobs, Skills and Innovation, Cultural and Behavioural Change, and Human Capital Development, to deliberate on submitted council memoranda.

The Technical Session received and considered seventy-eight (78) memoranda from the Federal Ministry of Youth Development, State Ministries for Youth, and other Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs). During the session, the Seventy-Eight (78) memoranda in four (4) thematic areas (Governance; Jobs, Skills

& Innovation; Human Capital Development; and Cultural & Behavioural Change) received from Federal and State Ministries of Youth Development nationwide, including the FCT, NGOs, and Academia were evaluated. After consideration, seventy-three (73) memoranda were passed by the Technical Committee, and recommendations were then made for onward presentation to the Council for consideration.

#### 3.2 PRESENTATION OF MEMORANDA

Seventy-three (73) memoranda were presented to the Council by the Technical Committee for consideration. The Council deliberated extensively on the memoranda and thereafter, approved twenty-seven (27) memoranda, noted twenty (20) that were for information purposes only, stepped down twenty (20) memoranda that did not meet the requirements for consideration, and directed that six (6) of the memoranda be merged with other memoranda with similar requests. The details of the seven-three (73) memoranda, with the Council's deliberations and decisions, are summarized in Annexure A.





#### **COUNCIL SESSION**

#### 4.1 OPENING

The Plenary Session of the Seventh (7th) Council Meeting was held on Thursday, 13th December, 2024. The opening ceremony which was tagged "Borno 2024" commenced with the rendition of the National Anthem.

#### **4.2 OPENING PRAYER**

Honourable Tijjani Goni, Special Adviser to the Governor of Borno State on Animal Development, offered the opening prayer.

#### 4.3 WELCOME ADDRESS

The Honourable Commissioner, Borno State Ministry of Youth, Sports Development and Poverty Alleviation, Honourable Comrade Saina Buba, in his address, welcomed members and all stakeholders to Maiduguri, the ancient city of Kanem-Borno, the "Home of Peace", for the 7th Session of the National Council on Youth Development (NCYD). He particularly appreciated the Executive Governor of Borno State, Professor Babagana Umara Zulum, for his resilience and determination, who, in the face of numerous adversities like the recent flood disaster, insisted on hosting this all-important meeting. He stated that the seventh meeting of the NYCD would create a veritable platform for taking decisions that will forge a brighter future together, acknowledging the incredible potentials of our young leaders. He further stated that, as a Commissioner of Youth, he is aware of the challenges faced by youths in Borno State, yet he is inspired by their resilience, creativity, and determination of the young people as they are not just the future but are the present drivers of change, even in the face of hardship. He went on to outline a few of the achievements of the Babagana Umara-led administration within the span of ten (10) months, specifically from November 2020 to August 2021, as follows:

- First batch disbursement of intervention fund to the tune of One billion, Sixty-One Million, Two Hundred and Thirty-Five Thousand Naira (₹1,061,235,000) only to two thousand, eight hundred and seventy-seven (2,877) able youths, five hundred and eleven (511) physically challenged persons, two hundred and sixty-seven (267) lepers, and compensations for one hundred and fifty-five (155) dead deceased individuals;
- Another batch of payment to the tune of Five Hundred and Seventy-Two Million, ii. One Hundred Thousand Naira (N572, 100,000) only was spent on the youth integration training programme in polytechnics;
- Three Hundred and Nine Million, Eight Hundred and Fifty Thousand Naira iii. (N329,850,000) only was given to three (3) Local Government youth development impact initiatives;
- The Borno State Government collaborated with the Bank of Industry to disburse Two iv. Billion, Five Hundred and Fifty Million Naira (₹2,150,000,000) only as a matching grant to twenty-four (24) cooperative societies in Borno State;



- The administration has set up seventeen (17) well-equipped entrepreneurial skills V. acquisition centres, and almost all the Local Government Areas have benefitted from them it;
- 1000 Electric motorbikes have been distributed to youth as a form of vi. empowerment;
- vii. One Hundred and Forty Million Naira (N140,000,000) is being deposited as transportation support to youths who indicate interest in returning to farming; and
- In collaboration with the Ministry of Transportation, Fifteen Thousand (15,000) youths were employed and trained as Road Marshals for the Borno State Transport Management Agency (BOTMA) to reduce unemployment.

He also recognized the support of the Development Partners and other key stakeholders, most especially the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), in ameliorating some of the youth challenges. He therefore urged the Council to openly engage in discussing the pressing issues affecting our youth in all ramifications, sharing insights, in order to come up with innovative solutions bearing in mind that the potential of our youth is not limited to any region or background, hence the need to join hands to unlock their greatness and the that of the nation in the long run.

#### 4.4 GOODWILL MESSAGES

#### 4.4.1 UNITED NATIONS POPULATION FUND (UNFPA)

The representative of the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), Dr. Babatunde Adelekan, expressed delight at the opportunity given to him to deliver a goodwill message on behalf of the UNFPA in the Council Meeting. He informed that the theme of the Council Meeting was timely and resonates deeply with the UNFPA's mission of empowering young people to realize their full potential. He added that Nigeria today stands at a pivotal point in its development journey, stating that with over 60 percent of its population under the age of twenty-five (25), the country is blessed with one of the world's most dynamic and promising youth demographics, which can be a driving force of sustainable development, peace and economic prosperity if adequately empowered and supported. He stressed that UNFPA strongly believes that investing in the holistic development of young people, such as providing access to quality education, relevant skills training, healthcare, economic opportunities, and creating safe spaces where young people can actively participate in decision-making processes that shapes their future, is essential for national growth. He went on to mention that in partnership with the Federal Government of Nigeria, Civil Society Organisations, and the private sector, UNFPA has supported various youth-focused initiatives including the revision of the National Youth Policy, working with States across the Country to ensure they have a roadmap for youth development, providing a platform for meaningful youth engagement, and empowering a lot of young people through skills development and entrepreneurship initiatives.

Furthermore, he stated that to effectively reposition Nigerian youths as a catalyst for economic development, he urged all stakeholders to consider the need to enhance policy implementation through the full implementation of Nigeria's National Youth Policy;



provide adequate resource allocation, particularly at the sub-national level; strengthen multi-sectoral collaborations and partners across all the sectors to provide integrated youth development; promote meaningful youth engagement involving young people in policy formulation, leadership and governance at all levels; ensure that young people have a seat at the table where decisions are being made about their future; foster civic engagement and leadership and promote youth-led initiatives that address social issues and promote positive change; and, support youth-driven innovations that address both local and global challenges while creating empowerment opportunities. He therefore called on the Council to remain committed to building a future where every Nigerian youth can thrive and contribute meaningfully to the nation's development. He concluded by stressing UNFPA's readiness to support and collaborate with the Government, Civil Society Organisations, and the private sector to transform the potential of the Nigerian Youth into an unstoppable force for positive change.

#### 4.4.2 THE UNITED NATIONS OFFICE ON DRUGS AND CRIME (UNODC)

Alhaji Yerima Mustapha, representing the Country Representative, who is also an indigene of Borno State, appreciated His Excellency, the Governor of Borno State, Professor Babagana Umara Zulum, for his leadership style. As an organization, he said that UNODC has been working closely with the Governments of Borno, Yobe and Adamawa States through the youth-championed initiatives designed to project the narrative of peacebuilding and reconciliation efforts that the Governments of these States have been undertaking. He spoke further on the achievements of UNODC over the years, which include reaching out to marginalized communities and supporting the protection of children in terrorist challenged communities. This programme has been handed over to the Borno State Government under the leadership of Honourable Gambo, the Borno State Ministry of Women Affairs and Social Development, and also the State Chapter of the National Orientation Agency. He concluded by calling on youths who have ideas that can be harnessed to make Borno State better to reach out to them, especially now that the Governor is working assiduously in that direction.

#### 4.4.3 NATIONAL COUNTER TERRORISM CENTRE

The representative of the National Coordinator of the National Counter-Terrorism Centre, Office of the National Security Adviser, Mrs. Iyem, extended the warm regards of the National Coordinator to the Council who appreciated the stakeholders for organizing the 7th NCYD. She stressed the timeliness of the event and communicated the determination of the ONSA to steadfastly support these platforms under the leadership of the Federal Ministry of Youth Development. She mentioned that for over a decade, Nigeria has faced the threat of violent extremism leading to terrorism. To this end, the ONSA has resolved to partner with the Ministry of Youth Development and relevant stakeholders to achieve peace in the nation. Speaking further, she said that the fact that the youth form the major component of violent extremist groups in Nigeria calls for concern and concerted effort from everyone, taking into cognizance that there can be no development without peace and security.

The ONSA, through the implementation of the Policy Framework and National Action Plan for preventing and countering violent extremism, is collaborating with the United Nations Office of Counter-terrorism and the United Nations Centre for Counter-terrorism on the youth engagement and empowerment programme. This programme aims to empower and



enable young people to contribute towards efforts to prevent and counter violent extremism, while also adding value to efforts to build the resilience of victims and fight against violent extremism and terrorism. The ONSA wishes to leverage the structure of the Alumni of this programme, which cuts across the six (6) geo-political zones of the country, using it as a focal point while working with the Federal Ministry of Youth Development. Consequently, she stated that the NCTC-ONSA continues to review its policy partnerships and coordination frameworks to meet the dynamism of youth in peacebuilding and economic processes in the country. She concluded by reiterating that the National Counter-Terrorism ONSA is committed to working with the Federal Ministry of Youth Development and all partners to that young people, who are a great resource in this country, are utilized to achieve national peace and security.

#### 4.4.4 YOUTH ORGANISATIONS

Sir, Ben Duotoye, the National President of the Nigerian Youth Workers Association, the umbrella body of Youth Development Practitioners in Nigeria, spoke on behalf of all Youth organizations. He commended and thanked the Governor of Borno State for hosting the National Council on Youth Development seeing that the last one was held about five (5) years ago, and encouraged him to continue the great work he is doing in the State. He corroborated the achievements of the Governor as highlighted by the Honourable Commissioner of Borno State in his speech by saying that, in his interactions with some of the youths while visiting some of the skills acquisition centres, he discovered that all that was said was true. On this note, he mentioned that, after having a meeting with the National Executive of the Nigerian Youth Workers Association present at the Council Meeting, comprising State Directors, and leaders of voluntary organisations, they had unanimously agreed to name the Headquarters of their office, which is to be commissioned in January, after the name of the Executive Governor of Borno State i.e Professor Babagana Zulum House, and hopes that, through collaboration with the Honourable Minister, he will be present to commission the office.. Still on this, he mentioned that Mr. President, Bola Ahmed Tinubu is the number one youth worker, followed by the Honourable Minister of Youth Development as number two youth worker, and Borno State's number one youth worker is the Governor of the State, and, as such, he was decorated as a Fellow of the Nigeria Youth Workers Association.

#### 4.4.5 DR. AHMED DUNOMA

The Permanent Secretary of Foreign Affairs, Dr. Ahmed Dunoma Umar representing the Honourable Minster of Foreign Affairs, appreciated and congratulated the Governor of Borno State for hosting the Council Meeting which speaks so much of his continued commitment and contribution to nation building and his unrelenting drive for good governance and sustainable development in the country. He also expressed delight in the choice of the theme for this year's Council, which is apt and topical especially in the time when the Bola Tinubu-led administration change agenda is paying special attention to youth empowerment and development. He said that when Governments at both Federal and State levels are vigorously pursuing policies aimed at creating opportunities and avenues that can empower the youth to contribute meaningfully to their communities and the country. He applauded the Borno State Government over the recently launched comprehensive



development initiative aimed at empowering youth, supporting teachers, and boosting the local economy in Borno State. He therefore urged the young ones to embrace all ongoing youth development and reforms being launched by the Federal and State Governments with a view to bringing real transformation and change to build a better future. He concluded by thanking the Governor of the state for accepting to host the National Council even when he was the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Youth Development. He thanked him for not going back on his word even when the state was hit by the flood disaster. He also thanked the Honourable Minister of Youth Development, the current Permanent Secretary and the Management staff of the Ministry for pushing through to see that the Council becomes a reality.

#### 4.5 KEYNOTE ADDRESS

The Honourable Minister of Youth Development, Comrade Ayodele Olawande, in his address, appreciated the Governor and the good people of Borno State for hosting the 7th National Council on Youth Development. He stated that this annual gathering reflects our collective commitment in advancing the interests of the young people in the country and he affirmed that our collective effort and contribution will lead to a productive outcome that will empower the young people of this country. He deeply appreciated the Governor of Borno State "the youth father" for hosting this all-important event despite the recent flooding, challenges and experiences that the State was going through which shows that his commitment to youth development is not in doubt and his hospitality has been very impressive. Speaking further, he said that this event was last held Five (5) years ago has been revived due to his leadership and support. He therefore called on all Governors to emulate the Borno State Governor by making youth development a priority in their respective States. He also mentioned that the theme of the event is aimed at transforming and repositioning the Nigerian Youth so that we will thrive in sustainable growth. To unlock the potentials of our youth, we must address the challenges that limits the abilities of our youth. To this end, he said decisions that will be reached at the Council Meeting will be guided by the key points of the theme (Governance, Job, Skills and Innovation, Culture and Behavioural Change, Human Capital Development) all of which are important in improving the quality of life of the young people. He therefore urged all Council members to join him in embracing these innovative solutions, actionable strategies, and collective approach that will empower the youth to thrive and focus on creating the legacy that we want Nigeria youth to play. He appreciated everyone that has worked tirelessly to ensure that this Council Meeting is a success and assured everyone that they will work with all stakeholders to achieve the outcome of this Council Meeting because no country ever prospers without making youth development a priority and called on all hands to be on deck to see the Nigeria of our dreams as this Government is set to support, empower and protect the youths.

#### 4.6 OPENING ADDRESS

The Executive Governor of Borno State, His Excellency, Prof. Babagana Umara Zulum, CON, mni, FNSE, FNIAE in his address welcomed the Hon. Minister of the Federal Ministry of Youth Development, Council members and all stakeholders to Maiduguri, Borno State. He acknowledged the importance of youth development in the nation's growth and progress. He expressed his delight in hosting this year's National Council on Youth Development where stakeholders brainstorm, innovate, interact and collaborate for the betterment of our nation. He mentioned that the State is greatly honoured to have hosted two

(2) National Councils within the span of two (2) weeks. He stated that the youth are the backbone of the society hence it behooves the nation to provide all the resources and support they need to thrive and develop to their full potentials. He stated further that investing in young people translates to investing in the nation's future and therefore reiterated the commitment of his government to creating opportunities for youths to grow and be successful. This, he buttressed by mentioning some of the initiatives his government has implemented aimed at empowering Borno youths including vocational training skills and programmes, education, scholarship distributions, tricycles, electric motor vehicles, and other entrepreneurial support. The youth population, he said, is an asset to the nation, which can translate to a very productive economy in the near future if well harnessed. He mentioned that the youth are faced with numerous challenges ranging from economic uncertainties, educational barriers and insufficient opportunities among many others. However, he said that it is inspiring to see many of our youths stepping out to become the architect of their destinies and our tomorrow. He informed the Council that Borno youths have greatly contributed to the peace and security and the overall development of the state. The seventh Council, he said, is expected to discuss strategies to harness the potential of youth, foster entrepreneurship, access to education, and ensure that every young person feels valued and supported. Moreover, he mentioned that it is imperative to address the unique needs of youths across different regions, and to embrace the diversities of our young people, ensuring that our policies are inclusive. Speaking on the review of the 2019 National Youth Policy, he called on the Council to break barriers in churning out policies that will give the youths the wings they need to fly. Speaking on his government, he said it is built on Seven (7) cardinal points, namely: Youth Empowerment, Education and Skills Acquisition, Entrepreneurial support, Job Creation, Sports and Recreation, Mental Health and Wellbeing, Good leadership and Civic Education. He expressed hope that the Council will come up with a robust, all-encompassing, effective and implementable National Youth Policy. He therefore charged everyone to work together to create and develop a clear and brighter future for young people and the nation as a whole.

He seized the opportunity to thank the Nigerian Youth Workers Association for naming their Headquarters after him and honouring him with a fellowship award and he assured them that he would attend the commissioning of the office as requested. He assured them that before the end of his tenure, many prorammes that are geared towards youth development would be churned out. He congratulated the Honourable Minister on his well-deserved appointment as the Minister of Youth Development He also thanked the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Bola Ahmed Tinubu and his Vice, Shettima for re-establishing NEMFUND; an agency that has sponsored about One Million (1,000,000) youths to study various programmes within the tertiary institutions in Nigeria. He thanked the Presidency for the foresight they have in establishing this agency. He also commended the organisers of this Council in Maiduguri and he assured that in the event that no other state is willing to host the next Council, Borno State is ready to host it again. At this point, he declared the Council Meeting opened.

#### 4.7 PAPER PRESENTATION

The theme of the 7th Council Meeting was "Transforming and Repositioning the Nigerian Youth to Thrive and Catalyze Economic Development".

In his thematic analysis, Prof. Musa Abdullahi stated that the National Bureau of Statistics' 2020 report informed that Nigeria is home to one of the largest youth populations in the





world, with approximately 60% of its population under the age of twenty-five (25).

This demography presents a unique economic growth and development opportunity if harnessed effectively. However, high unemployment rates, underemployment, and limited access to quality education and skills training hinder this potential. To transform and reposition Nigerian youth, it is essential to focus on enhancing education, fostering entrepreneurship, promoting skills development, and encouraging civic engagement. He further stated that youth and national development are intricately linked, as young people are future leaders and the workforce of a country. Investing in youth development is crucial for the progress and prosperity of a nation.

The youth in Nigeria and other regions of the globe are categorized as individuals who have the potential to shape the future of society. They are not only the future leaders but also the catalysts for change in the present. Young people represent a valuable human capital capable of making substantial contributions to the economic and political progress of the nation in many areas, such as education, healthcare, technology, and social justice. Accordingly, capitalizing on the entrepreneurial capacity of Nigeria's young population may provide the nation with fresh opportunities for economic expansion and creative advancement.

Prof. Musa Abdullahi also mentioned some of the challenges confronting the Nigerian youth as limited availability of practical and high-quality education, strictly restricted employment opportunities, lack of access to business assistance funds and migration, impairment of access to dependable healthcare, over-dependence on oil, over-exposure to negative western cultures, distanced from cherished cultural values, overexposure to the culture of greed and corruption, ethnicity and lack of National consciousness and others.

In proffering a way forward, he further stated that the government needed to provide a conducive environment for the young to accomplish their target goals. Thus, investing in the development of young people is crucial for the future of a nation due to the clear correlation between the attitude of young people and the aspirations for future growth in any community. However, the suffering caused by Boko Haram, militancy, armed robberies, scams, and other forms of social deviance may be attributed to the absence of effective governance and a clear vision for national progress.

After he mentioned that education and skill development, fostering civic engagement and leadership, and harnessing technology and innovation are the strategies for transforming and repositioning the youths, he gave the following recommendations as catalyze that will enable the youths to thrive for economic development: curriculum reform; enhanced access to funding; mentorship programmes; community engagement initiatives; technology accessibility; establishing a conducive socio-economic and political atmosphere; revitalizing and revamping the whole educational system at every level; vigorous campaign against all manifestations of corruption; and implementation of a strategy of youth's inclusion in all national agendas.

#### 5.0 COUNCIL'S RESOLUTIONS

Taking into account the theme of the 7th NYCD and the extensive discussions on all matters related to the memoranda presented, Council resolved as follows:

Acknowledged the active participation of all participants and the valuable contributions received, which greatly contributed to the successful outcome of the Seventh





#### meeting of the NYCD.

- ii. Commended the Federal Ministry of Youth Development for its outstanding efforts in fostering cohesion among youths through a variety of commendable initiatives and programs, which have promoted unity, collaboration, and empowerment, enabling young people to contribute meaningfully to national development.
- iii. Given the increasing number of gaps in Council memoranda submitted by States, the Federal Ministry of Youth Development should enhance the capacity of States in preparing these memoranda and develop a standardized template for the NCYD memoranda to ensure uniformity and consistency in all submissions.
- iv. Acknowledged the challenges facing the Nigerian youth and the need to empower them to contribute to National development and prosperity.
- v. Acknowledged the National Orientation Agency's engagement activities conducted with relevant parties, including youths, government agencies, and private sector organizations, to ensure a collaborative inclusive approach and information sharing.
- vi. Acknowledged NAPTIP's continuous partnership with organizations to provide vocational training and economic empowerment programs for vulnerable youth and victims of human trafficking that will promote innovation hubs and accelerators that provide young entrepreneurs with access to resources, mentorship, and funding.
- vii. Urged the Federal Ministry of Youth Development to enhance its communication of programs and projects to the States to facilitate replication where feasible and ensure the dissemination of valuable information to stakeholders.
- viii. Urged the Federal Ministry of Youth Development to establish an effective monitoring and evaluation framework to ensure proper assessment of the impact of programs and initiatives, and to enable appropriate interventions when necessary.
- ix. Urged the Federal Ministry of Youth Development to effectively coordinate and follow up on Council decisions to ensure timely implementation by all stakeholders.
- x. The Federal Ministry of Youth Development to convene a quarterly meeting of the Honourable Minister, Commissioners of State accompanied by their respective Permanent Secretaries to review the progress made at repositioning youth to thrive and catalyze economic development.
- xi. Urged the Federal Ministry of Youth Development to review the National Youth Policy and subsequently, States should develop, review, and domesticate it, incorporating their local peculiarities.
- xii. Urged the Federal Ministry of Youth Development to initiate a legal framework for National Youth Policy (NYP) to promote youth inclusiveness in governance structures.
- xiii. Urged State Governments to create a platform for youth dialogue and advocacy such as the State Youth Parliament.

- xiv. Urged the Federal Ministry of Youth Development to develop a Youth Data Base and encouraged States to do the same, ensuring comprehensive data collection and management.
- xv. Requested MDAs with youth-component initiatives/programmes to periodically submit reports of their activities to the Federal and State Ministries of Youth Development, for coordination purpose(s).
- xvi. Formation of the State Chapters of the Nigeria Youth Workers Association across the Federation, and encouragement of all Youth Work Practitioners to join.
- xvii. CLTC should be encouraged in providing the innovative leadership training that would enable the youth gain courage, self-confidence, team spirit, initiative and other essential qualities for good governance.
- xviii. State Governments should partner with the C&LTC to establish training schools in the States where none exists at the moment.
- xix. National Youth Service Corps to seek Presidential assent to establish a TRUST FUND, which will serve as an instrument that will facilitate the training and empowerment of Youth in different skills areas and provide start-up capital and grants to enable trained corps members establish their businesses.
- xx. The educational curriculum must be reformed to focus on practical skills that align with industry needs that is vital for equipping the youth with the necessary skills to thrive in a competitive market.
- xxi. Requested the Federal and State Governments to strengthen the implementation of NIYEAP and SYEAC at both Federal and State levels.
- xxii. Requested that CLTC establish Man O' War Clubs in the Secondary Schools nationwide in order to sensitize the young people on moral and cultural values which will impact positively on their personal and national life.
- xxiii. Requested the Federal and State Governments to establish the Youth Eco-Green Program (YEG-P) for tree planting in collaboration with the Ministry of Environment at Federal and State level.
- xxiv. Requested the State Governments to establish Mental Health and Psycho-Social Support Programmes (MHPS) at State levels in view of the fact that young people are battling with mental health issues.
- xxv. Requested State Governments to allocate at least 15% of the States' budget for
  - Development and to be domiciled in the Ministry in charge of Youth Development.
- xxvi. Urged State Governments to establish a Youth Development Fund to support human capital development in their respective States.
- xxvii. Requested the Federal Ministry of Youth Development to establish/upgrade Youth

Innovation Centres in all the six (6) geo-political zones in the Country.

- xxviii. Requested the Federal Ministry of Youth Development through the CLTC to institute a mandatory specialized citizenship and leadership training programme for NCE graduates.
- xxix. Requested State Governments to establish a stand-alone Ministry of Youth Development.
- xxx. Urged Federal and State Governments to send candidates to the University of Abuja for training programmes mentioned and also request other tertiary institutions to key into the programmes.
- xxxi. Requested Federal and State Governments to ensure that at least 30% of the registered vendors and public sector contracts are awarded to youth-led businesses.
- xxxii. Urged States to key into targeted interventions at the Federal level to develop Nigeria's bamboo industry as a key driver of economic diversification, job creation, and environmental sustainability.
- xxxiii. The Establishment of Model Skills Acquisition Training Center in the North Central, North West, South East, South West, and South South Zones.
- xxxiv. The establishment of Demonstration Green House Farms in each of the National Youth Development Centres and allocation of necessary resources and funding for the implementation of the project.
- xxxv. Requested State Governments to intensify efforts to prevent youths from engaging in drug use.
- xxxvi. The need to mainstream gender and physically challenged people's issues in youth development programme for inclusivity.
- xxxvii. Approved the establishment of a week-long activity leading to the celebration of National Youth Day on the 1st of November every year.
- xxxviii. Urged all states of the Federation to develop a State Action Plan on Youth, Peace and Security.
- xxxix. Approved mandatory training of professional Youth Development Officers at the Federal, State and Local Government Areas using Citizenship and Leadership Training Centres as venues for the training programme.
- xl. Approved partnerships between states and the Federal Ministry of Youth to develop a National Bamboo Strategy while encouraging states to allocate suitable land for bamboo cultivation, particularly in Southern regions with optimal climatic conditions.
- xli. Endorsed the establishment of Youth Centers for Bamboo Training and Innovation in collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Youth while encouraging the development of manufacturing hubs in Northern states in partnership with state governments and the





#### Federal Ministry of Youth.

- xlii. Requested for inclusive policies to ensure access for marginalized groups, including women, rural populations, and the disabled.
- xliii. Requested for the development of Monitoring and Evaluation framework for regular assessment of human capital initiatives to ensure effectiveness and adaptability.
